Stands at 19% containment.

Today, the Santa Ana winds are expected to diminish but humidity will remain at low levels, therefore, the RED FLAG WARNING will remain in effect till 6:00PM this evening. Firefighters continue to aggressively engage in fire suppression. Building and strengthening containment lines while providing for operational and personnel safety. Additionally, there are over 2,000 CAL Guard members involved in the firefight.

Stands at 45% containment.

Today's efforts are focused on mop up and reinforcing containment lines to ensure perimeter control. Hazard trees along roadways are being mitigated to protect both firefighters and the public. The fire is expected to remain within its current footprint, with aircraft continuing to support firefighters with retardant drops in inaccessible terrain. As repopulation efforts progress, the focus remains on ensuring that people are brought back into a safe and secure environment. Contingency resources are strategically prepositioned and ready to respond throughout communities along the fire's western edge to due to the Santa Ana wind conditions.

- **Deadline:** Submit your request within **30 days** of the incident (extended due to widespread outages and fires).

Queen Mary: The Queen Mary hotel in Long Beach announced that it will be pricing rooms for fire evacuees at \$189. The reservation will include a voucher for a breakfast buffet for two people. The reservation will also waive pet and Historical Preservation fees.

Big Bear: Free lodging from Airbnb and \$25 dining vouchers.
